2022 STATISTICAL BREAKDOWN OF GRANT AND MEMBERSHIP

In 2022, grant aid amounted to approximately €935,000 including grants and interest free loans. This is a increase of approximately €135,000 (14%) over the amount of assistance given in 2021.

Of this figure grants (non-repayable) totalled €578,000 which is a increase of 10% from 2021.

Repayable grant aid amounted to €357,000 which is a 21% increase from 2021.

We are limited by legislation to a maximum amount of €3,174 being on loan to a member at any one time.

Grants or loans were considered in 879 cases, an increase of 179 cases from 2021.

The breakdown of grant aid by category is similar to other years as follows;

The age profile for grant aid was as follows:

With 65% of grant aid going to members between the ages of 41 and 60, this age range continues to be the most likely when our members will seek assistance.

Unsurprisingly, the bulk of the aid went to members serving in the clerical and service grades with 56% going to the Clerical Officer and similar type pay grades. 14% of grant aid cases were for retired members of staff.

Dublin based members comprise 21% of the grant aid allocated in the course of the year but taking in the catchment counties of Wicklow, Meath and Kildare, 31% of grant aid is allocated in and around the capital. Tipperary comprises 8% of the grant allocation, which is the highest percentage after Dublin.

Another consistent statistic is that 69% of applications are made by female members of staff as opposed to 31% from their male colleagues.

This is reflective of the current gender balance within the civil service (69% female, 31% male -24/06/22). However, from experience, it also reflects the fact that men are less inclined to come forward for help and it is often left to their female partner to approach the Society on their behalf.

In summary, the statistical breakdown shows a significant increase from the previous year.
